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Patient Rated Wrist Evaluation - an overview ...

PRWE is the Patient-Rated Wrist Evaluation. The PRWE is a 15-item questionnaire designed to measure wrist pain and disability in activities of daily living. Developed in 1998 for clinical assessment and is used for specific wrist problems. It is one of the reliable upper extremity outcome instrument.[1]

PRWE Score - Physiopedia

Rate the average amount of pain in your wrist/hand over the past week by circling the number that best describes your pain on a scale from 0-10. A zero (0) means that you did not have any pain and a ten (10) means that the pain is the worst possible (i.e. worst you have ever experienced or that you could not do the activity because of pain).

For either method, the higher the score, the poorer the outcome. 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INTRODUCTION: The Patient-Rated Wrist Evaluation (PRWE) questionnaire is used to evaluate functional outcomes after treatment of wrist and hand injuries and nontraumatic conditions. Since patients commonly present with an injury, it is impossible to assess preinjury physical functioning.

The Patient-Rated Wrist Evaluation (PRWE) is a patient-reported questionnaire focusing on symptoms and function in wrist pathologies. It consists of 15 questions regarding pain and functional activities of the wrist.

Validity of the Patient-Rated Wrist Evaluation ...

The Patient Rated Wrist Evaluation (PRWE) is a region-specific outcome measure that evaluates wrist-related disability. It contains 15 items: five of which evaluate pain (intensity and frequency) and 10 evaluate function (specific activities and usual activities).
